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CHAIR BOLOSAN: Good morning, everybody. It's 9:01. The meeting of the liquor commission is now called to order, and let's have roll call, and please acknowledge your presence by stating here or present when called upon.

Jamie Becraft.

VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Present.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Bruce U'u.

COMMISSIONER U'U: Present.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Aaron Boswell.

COMMISSIONER BOSWELL: Here.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Stan, Stanley Ruidas.

COMMISSIONER RUIDAS: Present.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Roberto Andrion.

COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Here.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Snehal Patel.

COMMISSIONER PATEL: Here.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Jerrybeth is excused today.

I do not see Sylvia Ho, but if she will come in --

COMMISSIONER HO: Present.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: Oh, all right. I'm sorry, Sylvia.

COMMISSIONER HO: No worries.

CHAIR BOLOSAN: All right. I'd like to call on --
to call Mimi DesJardins.

1 CORP COUNSEL DESJARDINS: Hi, good morning,
2 everyone.

3 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Good morning.
4 Director Layne Silva.

5 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Present.

6 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Deputy Director Jarrett
7 Kahooohanohano.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOHANO: Present.

9 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Are you here?

10 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOHANO: Present.

11 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Jarrett.

12 And do we have Maria Khangsengsing?

13 MS. KHANGSENGSING: I'm here.

14 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Thank you, Maria.

15 Lianne Suzuki, are you here?

16 MS. SUZUKI: Yes, I am.

17 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Did I miss anyone?

18 (No response.)

19 CHAIR BOLOSAN: If not, we'll go on the agenda for
20 August 11, 2021. May I have a motion for approval?

21 COMMISSIONER PATEL: I make a motion to approve the
22 agenda.

23 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Sne, you've got the motion.
24 Second by?

25 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: I second.

1 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Jamie, you've got the second
2 for the agenda of August 11, 2021. Okay. Hang on, please.

3 All those who are in favor, say aye. Please raise
4 your hand so your vote can be counted.

5 (Response.)

6 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Any opposed?

7 (No response.)

8 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Motion carried.

9 And let's move on -- on the minutes of liquor
10 commission for July 14th, 2021, regular meeting. May I have a
11 motion for approval?

12 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Mr. Chair, Jamie Becraft.

13 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Jamie, you've got the motion. And
14 seconded by?

15 COMMISSIONER U'U: I'll second.

16 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay, Bruce. Bruce, you've got the
17 second. Hang on. All of -- in favor, say aye, please raise
18 your hand.

19 (Response.)

20 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Opposed?

21 (No response.)

22 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Motion carried.

23 So we have public testimony. Public testimony is
24 limited to three minutes per agenda item. Please sign up in
25 the chat and indicate which agenda item you wish to testify

1 on.

2 Okay. I don't see nobody on the chat area. Anyone
3 wants to testify?

4 (No response.)

5 CHAIR BOLOSAN: If not, public hearing is closed.

6 We're moving very fast. Next is General Licensing
7 Matter, Item A through C. May I have a motion for
8 confirmation? Motion for confirmation?

9 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: (Gesturing.)

10 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Jamie, you've got the motion.

11 COMMISSIONER PATEL: (Gesturing.)

12 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Sne, you've got your second.

13 All of -- in favor, say aye, please raise your --

14 (Response.)

15 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Opposed?

16 (No response.)

17 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Motion carried.

18 Now, next is we have Administrative Affair. May I
19 have either the director or deputy director to cover this
20 administrative affair?

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: Okay. Item A,
22 requesting approval for Form DLC-001, which is the license
23 application checklist. In front of you, you have the final
24 copy of what we're requesting, and the only change that we
25 made was on page 2 under Fieldprint Hawaii. On the old form,

1 it gave the department of liquor control's Fieldprint code,
2 and according to the federal guidelines, we're not allowed to
3 have fingerprints not attached to an accepted permit
4 application. So what we did is just change it out from the
5 code to fingerprint instructions will people -- I'm sorry,
6 will be provided when all requirements of the liquor license
7 application have been met. So that's the only change, we took
8 out the Fieldprint code, and we put in that statement so we
9 can be in compliance with the federal government, yeah.

10 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Do you have anything to
11 cover, Director Layne?

12 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: No, that's -- what Jarrett
13 explained is -- is exactly correct. According to the Hawaii
14 Criminal Justice Data Center, we're not -- we're not supposed
15 to have any criminal history record file on file without
16 having a license application on file. And what seemed to be
17 happening is by providing that code in advance, it was kind of
18 inviting some of the applicants to go out and go get their
19 fingerprints done prior to submitting the application, which
20 is not in compliance with the requirements as far as Hawaii
21 Criminal Justice Data Center is concerned.

22 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay.

23 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: I have a question.

24 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Any questions from the commissioner?

25 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Chair, this is Roberto

1 Andrion. I have a question.

2 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Go ahead.

3 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Or maybe a clarification.
4 So, Director Silva, I guess this is just to -- for my
5 reference, so when there's an applicant that fingerprint is
6 required, who does the -- who does the fingerprinting? Is
7 that a place that they have to go on their own, or is that
8 dictated by -- by the commission?

9 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Well, the -- we do it
10 here, we have -- well, you know, when we're not in -- under
11 COVID restrictions; however, it's being done through a company
12 called Fieldprint Hawaii. And what it is is they need to go
13 online and make an appointment to go and have it done. So
14 it's -- it's a third party, it's not affiliated with the
15 department, but Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center accepts
16 fingerprints from that particular company, and through an
17 agreement, they forward that results directly to us here at
18 the department.

19 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: So -- so is that -- just a
20 follow-up again. So is that print accepted by the -- by the
21 department?

22 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yes, yes.

23 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Thank you.

24 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: You're welcome.

25 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Go ahead, Jamie.

1 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

2 As a follow-up, Layne, to Roberto's question, I was
3 under the impression we had live scan, or you folks had live
4 scan in your office and that you guys were able to do the
5 fingerprinting.

6 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: We are able to, yes, but
7 as of right now, we are back under that we're not doing any
8 in-person meetings because of the COVID, but we do have that
9 capability, yes.

10 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: So is the plan to -- to start
11 doing it ourselves at some point, or were we doing it
12 ourselves at some point?

13 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yeah, we -- we were prior
14 to COVID. It's an option for the applicants because they're
15 not all here. Fieldprint Hawaii has accessible offices all
16 throughout America, I believe there's an office on Molokai, so
17 it's an option for the applicants as compared to having to
18 come here.

19 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Okay. And then I guess my last
20 question is, is how -- how do our applicants know that they
21 can come to the office and do it?

22 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: They're informed. It is
23 one of the options on the checklist, I believe.

24 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Any more questions from the
25 commissioners?

1 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: If you look at Item No. 2,
2 it's the live scan fingerprinting at the department of liquor
3 control that's on the checklist.

4 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Thank you, Layne. And then I
5 guess one last question is, just verifying, is this form
6 online, and is it fillable online?

7 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yes.

8 CHAIR BOLOSAN: This checklist.

9 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yes, it is.

10 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Fillable also?

11 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yeah.

12 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Thank you. I appreciate it,
13 Layne.

14 That's -- Mr. Chair, that's all the questions I
15 have.

16 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Jamie.

17 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: You're welcome.

18 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Any questions from the
19 commissioners?

20 (No response.)

21 CHAIR BOLOSAN: If not, I just want to interject
22 something. Mr. Director, because of the spike of the pandemic
23 cases, you're -- the department cannot give lots of exam to
24 have the alcohol card, so is there any plan to speed things
25 up? Because for now, I believe so, there's a lot of people

1 that need the card so they can serve alcohol at their working
2 place. Is there any future plan on how?

3 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: If you don't mind, I think
4 I will redirect that question to Deputy Director
5 Kahooohanohano. He's pretty much been spearheading the --

6 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay.

7 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: -- the certification exams
8 and education sessions. But, yeah, there -- you know, it's
9 kind of a touch-and-go thing because of the recent spikes in
10 COVID. And with that being said, Jarrett, if you don't mind,
11 I'll turn the floor over to you.

12 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOHANO: All right. So
13 because of this COVID spike, we had to cancel our exam on the
14 17th. We right now currently have exams for the 24th and the
15 31st, but given the numbers and the way -- there's a
16 possibility that that might be canceled also. We're trying to
17 hopefully get this thing online as soon as possible so we can
18 do a better job and just have people get certified without
19 having to come down here. As of right now, we don't have
20 anything solid for an online thing, but we do have
21 certification exams scheduled for September also, but, again,
22 with the COVID numbers, hopefully, they won't be canceled also
23 like the 17th. Yeah, so we're trying -- we're trying to make
24 sure we can get the public certified so they can go and
25 continue to do what they need to do.

1 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: (Gesturing.)

2 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Jamie, go ahead.

3 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

4 Jarrett, the -- I totally understand the -- that you
5 guys have to move it back and stuff, but, as a result, for
6 those who are having expired licenses, are we giving further
7 extensions for that, or are they just not allowed to serve
8 anymore?

9 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: No. With the
10 expiration of the certification cards, their certification
11 cards, as long as it wasn't expired prior to March 1st of
12 2020, they're still valid up until the end of the emergency
13 rules period and then 90 days extended after that. So anybody
14 whose card is expired, like I said, after March 1st, 2020,
15 they still have a valid card until that -- it comes to pass.

16 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Okay. Thank you. And then the
17 last is, is the application process; I'd seen that earlier how
18 it's being done right now, and it's not online or anything,
19 and it was kind of quick in time. Are we in the process of
20 giving them more than one day's notice?

21 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: Yes. So I'm in the
22 process of sending out -- when we do post it online on our
23 website, we're gonna give them the option to, what you call,
24 put in their request or application online via email, and
25 we'll process through that, and then we will inform them

1 first-come, first-served basis on that instead of waiting
2 until the day before to get them into the class the day after
3 that. So hopefully that opens up -- open up a window, and we
4 can -- we can better help them with their scheduling, so they
5 don't have to take off for three days or two days just in
6 hopes to get into the exam.

7 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Okay. Thank you.

8 That's all I have, Mr. Chair. Thank you, Jarrett.

9 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Jamie.

10 Any other --

11 COMMISSIONER PATEL: (Gesturing.)

12 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Sne, go ahead. You get the
13 floor.

14 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Thank you, Chair.

15 So I think we still have to approve -- I don't want
16 to take up more time, 'cause we can always go back to this
17 and -- when Layne talks about his monthly report, 'cause we
18 still have to approve the form, yeah. But a point of order,
19 Chair, right, we still have to approve the license application
20 checklist or --

21 CHAIR BOLOSAN: You want to cover that, Director
22 Layne?

23 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yes, that has been brought
24 before you guys for approval, to approve the change that's
25 being proposed, so there --

1 COMMISSIONER PATEL: So --

2 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: -- you guys would have
3 to vote to approve.

4 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah. So I would just like to
5 make a motion to approve that before we move forward in
6 further discussion, just so we can take care of that business.

7 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Do I have a motion?

8 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: (Gesturing.)

9 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Go ahead, Jamie.

10 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: I second. I second Sne's
11 motion.

12 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. All in favor, say aye.

13 (Response.)

14 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Opposed?

15 (No response.)

16 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Motion carried. Excuse me.

17 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah. My only question was the
18 indoor rules right now, Layne, is ten, so can we just limit
19 the class size to ten and just try to get people ten at a time
20 to take? How many applicants are there that are -- that are
21 going for this? Jarrett maybe knows.

22 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Yes. Jarrett, go ahead.

23 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: Yeah. So as of
24 right now, we were allowing 25 in the class, but since the
25 governor's mandate has changed to indoor -- indoors ten,

1 outdoors -- 20 or 25, we're gonna have to -- we're gonna have
2 to actually downsize the classes. And because of that, I'm --
3 I'm hoping that we can work a schedule to where hopefully we
4 can get more classes or more certification exams within the
5 month, so we can at least cover the 20 a week, so -- you know
6 what I mean --

7 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah.

8 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOANO: -- that we've been
9 covering 25 a week. So that -- we would have to schedule
10 with -- that with the service vendor and whatnot, but that --
11 yeah, we're gonna have to take it down to ten because of the
12 new mandate from the governor.

13 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Okay. And then my next
14 question is: With the online testing that you've looked into,
15 what companies have you approached, or have you gotten that
16 far yet?

17 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOANO: No, we haven't
18 approached any companies. We're still trying to pin down
19 exactly -- we're getting assistance from Honolulu Liquor
20 Commission, but I believe they developed their own and --
21 fortunately for them, they have their own IT department that
22 works under them.

23 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah.

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOANO: So we tried to get
25 as much information from them so we can -- we can push forward

1 and get this -- get this thing online so we can schedule more
2 of them and we don't have to worry about numbers of people
3 attending the classes.

4 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah. So I just took a
5 certification exam through PSI, it's a company that does a lot
6 of professional certifications, and so I would say if you
7 wanted to jot that down and I can get you guys that info as
8 well. They do -- they do a great job, I feel, in making sure
9 it's secure and, you know, it was a smooth exam online. I
10 just had to take one for certification. So I just kind of
11 wanted to -- to bring that to light for you folks, you know.
12 Of course, you can shop around, but, you know, I felt like
13 they were easy to use. A lot of times, you get to technology,
14 and it's like, oh, you know, but this one seemed pretty basic
15 and straightforward.

16 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: Yeah. If you
17 wouldn't mind, whatever information you have, just shoot me an
18 email, and then I can -- I can do more research on it, and
19 hopefully, we can move on that or whatever company that we can
20 come up with or if we're gonna do it ourselves.

21 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Okay. Yeah, 'cause if we don't
22 have an IT department, we probably -- you know, doing it
23 ourselves would be a bit labor some --

24 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANO: Yeah.

25 COMMISSIONER PATEL: -- and maybe putting resources

1 where we don't have it, so it's nice when we go with a company
2 that already is a professional in that, and we just outsource
3 that. 'Cause then it's secured, they're liable for that
4 security as well, which takes it off of our internal servers
5 or anything. Right? Yeah, but we can discuss further later.
6 Thanks, Jarrett.

7 DEPUTY DIRECTOR KAHOOHANOHANO: Yeah, no problem.
8 Thank you.

9 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Sne.

10 Any comment from the commissioners? Questions?

11 (No response.)

12 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Well, if not -- okay. I'm gonna
13 cover a few things. The liquor control adjudication board
14 meeting of August 5th, 2021, was canceled. The next regular
15 meeting of the liquor control commission is --

16 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Whoa.

17 CHAIR BOLOSAN: -- scheduled for September 8, 2021.

18 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Hold on, Chair.

19 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Chair, I think we still
20 need to go over Item B, the Director's Monthly Report.

21 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Oh, I'm sorry. Well, that's why I
22 didn't say anything. I'm sorry. I like that.

23 Okay. Go ahead. Layne, I'm going to --

24 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Okay. Thank you. So --
25 and I'll keep this brief.

1 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay.

2 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: The director's monthly
3 report this month, the COVID-19 public health emergency rule
4 24-hour shutdowns, there were no 24-hour shutdowns in the
5 month of July.

6 The -- we just completed the -- receiving gross
7 liquor sales reports for all licensees that renewed, all have
8 submitted. There are still six licensees that we are working
9 with to make whatever corrections were still needed to be made
10 to their gross liquor sales report.

11 Continuing on, the state legislature did approve and
12 pass House Bill 136, becoming into law as Act 066. It will be
13 effective on January 1st, 2022. And just a brief description
14 of what was approved is it applies to liquor licensing
15 provisions related to the transfer of licenses and the denial
16 of licenses to limited liability companies effective January
17 5th, 2022. That's how it's gonna be described and changed
18 within the HRS, Hawaii Revised Statutes; however, in our rule,
19 in Maui County's rule, it is a lot -- we went a lot deeper in
20 depth with our rule than was in HRS prior to this, so a lot of
21 it was already addressed in our rules.

22 I think the one thing that stands out to me, as I
23 read it, was that it seems like we're going away from the
24 language that says -- using the language of fit and proper in
25 relation to an applicant, and it's moving more in the

1 direction of compliant or -- it basically applies to statutory
2 requirements instead of fit and proper. As long as the
3 applicant meets all statutory requirements, then they would be
4 able to be approved as an applicant or as a licensee. So
5 that -- that's as far as the state, 31st state legislature is
6 concerned.

7 And there is also -- I believe included in your
8 packet is a list of licensees for Fiscal Year 2021-'22. So
9 basically, that list right there will show you exactly all who
10 made it through the renewal process and are still licensees
11 within Maui County.

12 And that's all I have on my report.

13 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Any question from the commissioners?

14 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: (Gesturing.)

15 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay, Robert.

16 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: I had a question.

17 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay, Robert.

18 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: This is the way -- maybe it
19 should be to -- to our attorneys, fit and proper, and I don't
20 know what the other word that was used to describe the
21 difference, can -- for a poor guy like me, can somebody
22 explain what -- what basically is the major difference between
23 that? 'Cause how -- how is -- how is those words gonna apply?
24 Can somebody explain that to me?

25 CORP COUNSEL DESJARDINS: Chair.

1 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Mimi, if you'd like, I'd
2 like to take a shot at that, if you don't mind.

3 CORP COUNSEL DESJARDINS: No, not at all. Go ahead.

4 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Okay. Robert, what
5 happens is when an application comes before the commission,
6 and in the summary, there's a description that is coming from
7 the investigator that is preparing that report, it seems like
8 the consensus was that fit and proper lends more to being an
9 opinion, whereas meeting all statutory requirements is based
10 on factual results of the investigation itself. So I guess
11 trying to get away from the fit and proper language, which
12 implies an opinion, which, you know, if you're not statutorily
13 eliminated or disqualified, then it doesn't lend towards an
14 opinion in that, in that (inaudible).

15 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Yes, okay. Director Silva,
16 thank you. I do -- I do understand the distinction now. I
17 think it's a good explanation (inaudible) somebody's opinion
18 is (inaudible). Thank you.

19 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Robert.

20 Any other question for this item?

21 (No response.)

22 CHAIR BOLOSAN: If not, I did read C already.

23 Should I read it again, or if not --

24 COMMISSIONER U'U: (Inaudible.)

25 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Thank you, Bruce.

1 I'll say thank you, Jarrett and Layne.

2 COMMISSIONER PATEL: The list of licensees --

3 CHAIR BOLOSAN: May I have a motion to adjourn?

4 Anyone hear me?

5 COMMISSIONER ANDRION: Yeah, this is Roberto. I
6 make a motion to adjourn.

7 COMMISSIONER U'U: Second.

8 CHAIR BOLOSAN: We have a motion. Okay. Bruce, you
9 got your second.

10 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Mr. Chair, Mr. Chair, I think
11 Commissioner Sne had a question.

12 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. I'm sorry, I didn't hear.

13 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yes. Layne, did you cover
14 No. 4 on your report, list of licensees for fiscal 2021-'22?

15 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: Yeah, just -- just to
16 mention that you all have a copy of that in your packet, and
17 that's for your review and for your information. You know,
18 you can use that as a comparison to prior to renewals just for
19 your own knowledge who actually made it through and who --
20 what licensees are still existing and -- and also including
21 the new ones that have become licensed since then.

22 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Okay. Yeah, I just wanted to
23 know -- this was in our packet and -- in terms of -- do we
24 have comparisons from previous year to this year, like
25 where -- where we stand in total number of licensees?

1 DIRECTOR LAYNE N. SILVA: I don't have that for you
2 right now, but I -- I could obtain those numbers, sure. Yeah.

3 COMMISSIONER PATEL: Yeah, I would like to know just
4 how we're doing.

5 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Just so I didn't miss
6 anything, anyone want to comment or question?

7 (No response.)

8 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Then, if not, may I have the motion
9 to adjourn?

10 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Mr. Chair.

11 COMMISSIONER U'U: I make the motion.

12 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: Make a motion --

13 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Bruce, you've got the motion.
14 Do I have a second?

15 VICE CHAIR BECRAFT: I second.

16 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Jamie got the second. All in
17 favor, say aye.

18 (Response.)

19 CHAIR BOLOSAN: Okay. Meeting adjourned. Thank you
20 very much, ladies and gentlemen.
