### Chapter 1 Introduction

Pg. 1-1, Line 28, Edit: ~~Some~~ Moloka`i residents are very protective of their rural and traditional-based lifestyles, and have resisted economic development centered on tourism and real estate.

Pg. 1-3, Population, first bullet, line 2: Colony, and later ~~became~~ Kalama`ula, ~~in 1921~~ by 1921 passage of the Hawaiian Homes...

Pg. 1-10, Line 4, Add Problem J:

Governance: Due to political, demographic, and district designations Moloka`i is not able to have a real voice in its own future.

Pg. 1-10, Line 15, Edit: B. Cultural Resources and Traditions: Moloka`i lui ahina. `Aina momona. Pule o`o. Moloka`i nakaheke. Moloka`i has an abundance.....

### Chapter 3 Natural, Heritage, and Scenic Resources - Section 3.2 Heritage Resources

Pg. 3-6, Line 9, Edit Issue 7:

The ecological effects of the Kaunakakai Wharf ~~are not well understood~~ have not been fully mitigated and are an ongoing concern.

Pg. 3-7, Add new policy:

Encourage adequate funding for ecosystem protection and restoration.

Pg. 3-9, Line 36 – 38, Edit:

~~Approximately 120~~ Moloka`i sites are listed in the State Historic Preservation Division's (SHPD) statewide Inventory of Historic Properties, and numerous ~~roughly 75 of those~~ Moloka`i sites have been entered in the Hawai`i and/or National Register of Historic Places.

Pg. 3-12, Add new policy:

Ensure that permits for any project that may affect historic property are provided to SHPD for review, and that SHPD's recommendations are issued as permit conditions.

Pg. 3-13, Add new action:

Provide educational training to applicable county agencies on the role that the county permit process plays in historic preservation. (Planning Department/SHPD)
