Maui County's General Election Places of Deposit opens Oct. 8

WAILUKU, Hawaii – Maui County's Places of Deposit, except for those located at Voter Service Centers, will open on Oct. 8, County Clerk Kathy Kaohu announced.

"We are opening most Places of Deposit on the same day ballot packages for Maui County voters are scheduled to be mailed out," County Clerk Kaohu said. "This means in addition to mailing their ballots back to us, voters will also be able to drop off their ballots at our designated Places of Deposit as soon as they have completed their voting."

The Place of Deposit opening date was officially changed on Oct. 1 by a supplemental proclamation issued by State Chief Election Officer Scott Nago. The supplemental proclamation can be viewed at <https://elections.hawaii.gov/main/supplemental-proclamation/>.

Places of Deposit located at Voter Service Centers are still set to open on Oct. 20. Voter Service Centers are located at the Mitchell Pauole Center Conference Room at Kaunakakai, Moloka'i, the Lana'i Police Station Conference Room at Lana'i City, Lana'i, and at the Velma McWayne Santos Community Center at Wailuku, Maui.

Free-standing Places of Deposit are available on Maui at seven fire station locations at Hana, Wailea, Kihei, Makawao, Kula, Napili and Kahului; three community centers at Haiku, Pa`ia and Lahaina Civic Center; and at the Kalana O Maui County building at Wailuku and inside the Aloha `Aina Center near Island Paws located at Haiku.
