

NOTICE TO ATTORNEYS AND LAW FIRMS INTERESTED IN
 PROVIDING LEGAL SERVICES TO THE
 OFFICE OF THE COUNTY AUDITOR FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI
 SOLICITATION NO. 21-02oca

Pursuant to Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Office of the County Auditor for the County of Maui invites attorneys and law firms licensed to practice law in the State of Hawaii to submit a letter of interest and statement of qualifications to provide legal services on a contract basis as the need arises for Fiscal Year 2022 (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022). A statement must be submitted pursuant to this Notice *even if similar statements have been submitted to the County of Maui's Department of the Corporation Counsel or the Maui County Council.*

The Office of the County Auditor for the County of Maui anticipates that it may retain attorneys or law firms qualified to practice in the following areas of law during Fiscal Year 2022 (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022):

Attorneys or law firms interested in being retained to provide legal services in these areas or any other area of practice must submit a letter of interest and a statement of qualifications that clearly present, at minimum, the following information:

1. The name of the attorney or firm, principal place of business, location of all of its offices, email addresses, and telephone numbers;
2. The areas of practice of the attorney or firm;
3. A summary of the education, experience, and qualifications of any attorney who would be performing substantial legal work or who would be communicating with the client;
4. A summary of the cases or other legal work done relevant to this Notice and the names and contact information of up to five (5) clients who may be contacted, including at least two (2) governmental clients; and
5. An overview of anticipated billing policies.

A letter of interest and statement of qualifications in response to this Notice should be addressed to the County Auditor, and mailed to the Office of the County Auditor, County of Maui, 2145 Wells Street, Suite 303, Wailuku, HI 96793 or emailed to county.auditor@mauicounty.us at least ten (10) calendar days before the beginning of a month in order to be eligible for consideration during that month and for the rest of the fiscal year. Submissions must be received no later than 4:00 p.m. May 20, 2022. For mailed responses, include an electronic copy of the submittal in searchable PDF format. For emails, the subject line should read: "In Response to Providing Legal Services to the

Office of the County Auditor”, attachments must be in searchable PDF format less than 10 megabytes.
